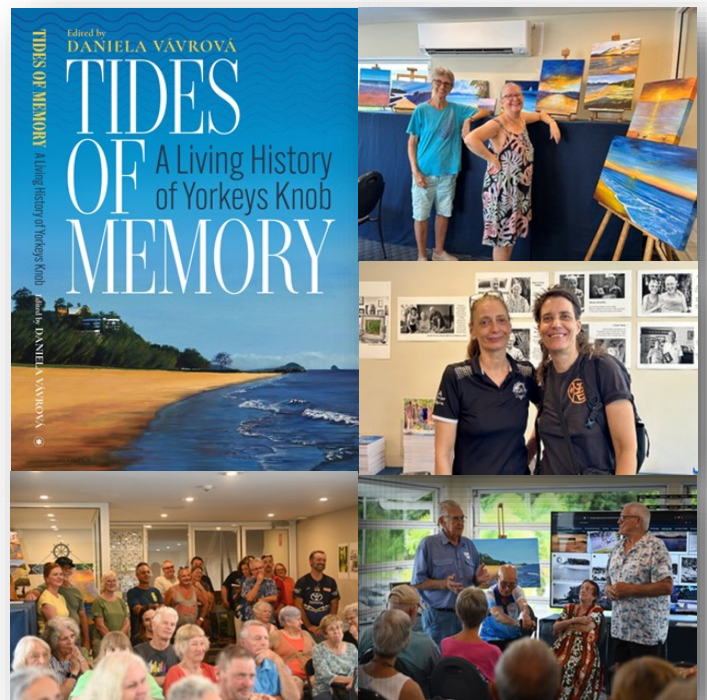

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## DISASTER RESILIENCE PLANNING

The YKRA Disaster Resilience Group discussed what actions are needed to prepare our community for an extreme weather event such as a cyclone or storm surge. The meeting agreed that an appropriate disaster response would include plans, preparation and identifying key residents with the commitment, skills and equipment needed to bridge the gap between the disaster and the arrival of assistance from outside our community.

Accordingly, we would like you to contact the YKRA if you are:

- Aged or infirm. We appreciate that older residents and people experiencing serious illness should be assisted before and after a major weather event.
- Willing to volunteer your time and skills and have available appropriate tools and or equipment [such as chainsaw, shovel, boat etc]

## TREE REMOVAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL DAMAGE

We have lost a number of large trees from the knob recently. Some of these were due to storms and/or slope instability, however others seem to have been cut down without good reason.

Two large gum trees were removed from a property in Buckley Street; the stated reason for their removal was because of root invasion into the adjacent building. However, Eucalyptus species have deep tap roots, rather than spreading root systems as do figs for example.

Two large street trees were removed from the frontage of another property in the same street

prior to the land being built on a couple of years ago for no apparent reason. Trees have been removed from vacant land in Dowsett Close in the last month. These trees did not impact on the building platform.

Their removal could have contributed to possible landslip which resulted in two more large trees falling down for no apparent reason a few days later. At least four large trees taken from a single site.

The point is that we are losing our tree cover on an adhoc basis without consideration of the impact on the wildlife we so value. It seems to be all too easy to remove a tree in Cairns. There are multiple reasons which can be used to gain permission. It's likely that many, if not the majority, of trees are removed without notifying Council.

Last month's newsletter contained an article by CAFNEC protesting the loss of our street shade trees. Cairns is part of the wet tropics; leafy and green. Our streetscapes and suburbs are filled with trees. We need the shade and the wildlife needs the habitat provided by trees. Council should review its policies to make it harder to simply come along and cut them down without sound reason, which is the current situation.

## CAIRNS AIRPORT NEWS

There is a lot going on at Cairns Airport. The following has been provided by David Stephens, who is a member of the consultation group.

### Airlines

Air New Zealand flights to begin again in March.

Singapore Airlines currently has four flights per week, increasing to five per week in July, daily from November.

Fiji Air has its first anniversary coming up, they have exceeded expectations, with a lot of passenger traffic from the USA.

Jetstar to Christchurch. The first anniversary coming is up. The service is going well with three flights per week.

There are discussions in place



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regarding the possibility of direct flights from Cairns to Vietnam.

## **Infrastructure:**

The Terminal One refurbishment project, staged over three years, is now complete

The covered car park at T1 was opened on the 27th February, 2026.

The outside façade of Terminal Two is undergoing maintenance and upgrades, and the Toilets are being refurbished.

Airport baggage systems continue to be upgraded.

The new Bus stop has been completed, near the International Terminal, however TMR have not yet finalised arrangements for the route.

Skyhaven Accommodation likely to commence this month, road works to the accommodation are currently under construction. Mandala Group will be managing the property.

GA (General Aviation) – Cairns Airport are currently building new premises for staff (ground staff and Airport Safety Officers).

Café at GA, Che Zest, has opened overlooking the runway.

Civil works are being carried out in the eastern precinct as you enter the airport. Land has been cleared and fill imported for works including a new hangar and car park.

## **New Queensland Ambulance Service Operations Centre**

Construction is now underway on a brand-new \$31.9 million Queensland Ambulance Service Triple Zero (000) Operations Centre and Regional Office in Cairns.

This purpose-built facility will support the highly skilled Emergency Call Takers and Emergency Medical Dispatchers who answer some of the most urgent calls for help in our community. Located on Anderson Street in Manunda, the new Operations Centre is expected to be operational in early 2028.

## **Boost to Buy Home Ownership Scheme**

The Boost to Buy scheme helps first home buyers earning less than \$150,000 (single) and \$225,000 (partnered), get into the market with as little as a 2% deposit. For a new property valued at \$750,000, an approved applicant could receive an equity contribution of up to \$225,000. The applicant's contribution would be a minimum of just \$15,000.

Round Two opens at 9am Tuesday 31 March, offering another 500 places, half reserved for regional Queenslanders.

## **Upgrade of Barlow Park**

This mega upgrade will provide Cairns with a brand-new grandstand increasing seating capacity from 1,700 to 5,000, improved player facilities and amenities, enhanced accessibility throughout the venue and upgraded equipment for athletes.

It is designed with tropical Cairns in mind and will ensure we are front and centre on the Green and Gold runway and for decades to come. Early works expected to begin soon after the footy season.
